U.S. Senatorial Candidate Dr. Eric Wargotz Wants Tax Methodology Shifted From Production to Consumption.



Making his first appearance on The Neal Asbury Show was Dr. Eric Wargotz, Republican U.S. Senatorial Candidate for Maryland and current Maryland Commission President. An experienced leader and activist; a physician-businessman, conservative, and conversationalist, Dr. Wargotz knows what it takes to work as a team and to build consensus on difficult matters.

A pathologist who works in laboratory medicine, Dr. Wargotz's career is marked by his ability to observe, but he doesn't like what he is "observing" in the way this country is being run. "It's time to return to solid American values, and end the heavy-handed dictatorial tactics used by this administration. We have to see tax methodology shift from production to consumption. Don't tax the people that make the products, tax the people that buy the products," he remarked.

Dr. Wargotz decided to run for office because he is "fired of the entrenched bureaucracy. I believe that there is a place for a fiscal conservative with traditional family values." He is attempting to unseat a 24-year incumbent, but believes he sees an opportunity to win.

A former Governor's Appointee to the Board of Physician Quality Assurance in Maryland, Dr. Wargotz suggested people should not be looking at what's in the new national healthcare plan, but what isn't. He says two glaring omissions of the plan are a lack of attention to man-power issues and to tort issues. "Healthcare should move to a free mar-

ket system, taking the cost burden off the backs of employers."

Dr. Wargotz never agreed with the stimulus plan under Bush or Obama because it was not going to jump start the economy. "The money for the plan went to rotting fruit on the vine – big bloated companies that were mismanaged. It should be used for the new shoots on the vine that cultivate new businesses."

He maintains that it's time to "change the fundamentals of how we do business. That starts with getting back to manufacturing, and stop economically punishing successful companies with taxes. And the government must favor U.S. companies over foreign companies when it comes to export policies."

As for his energy policy recommendations, he favors simple solutions. He wants to see more drilling in the continental shelves and the pursuit of green technology programs. He wants to see the U.S. move away from a dependence on foreign oil

"Look we're all environmentalists. It doesn't matter what you believe about global warming. We all favor clean air and clean water."

Closing out his final nationally syndicated "The Neal Asbury Show" for 2009 on WZAB-AM, Neal Asbury opened the show by characterizing 2009 as the Year of Squandered Opportunity, recalling how President Obama started the year with historically high approval ratings and ended the year with history's lowest approval ratings. Asbury predicted that 2010 will be the year that "we take back the America we love," which will be reflected in the results of the midterm elections.
